## First Atmospheric Studies Colloquium in Brazil



On March 24-25, 2025, the first Brazilian Atmospheric Studies Colloquium took place in Nitéroi, Brazil, with the title: "I Atmospheric Studies Colloquium: Readings about Climate, Humors, and Atmospheres in the Humanities."

Organized by the *no.ar lab* (Laboratory for the Study of Everyday Life and Technology) from the Universidade Federal Fluminense de Campos dos Goytacazes, the event brought together scholars from diverse disciplines to explore the question of atmospheres for the first time in Brazil. More than thirty researchers from Brazil, Argentina, Portugal, and Japan participated in the colloquium, both in person and online. **Among them, also three members of KOIAS took part: Yuho Hisayama, Satomi Abe, and Alberto Parisi.** 

The colloquium represented a significant step in globalizing Atmospheric Studies, fostering valuable exchanges between scholars from South America, Europe, and Asia. By integrating humanities-based approaches—such as philosophy, cultural studies, and aesthetics—with environmental and technological inquiries, the event laid groundwork for future collaborations in the field of Atmospheric Studies.

KOIAS celebrates this successful initiative and anticipates continued partnership with no.ar Lab and other international networks in Brazil to advance research on atmospheres.
