The Kobe Institute for Atmospheric Studies (KOIAS) is pleased to announce the publication of the article “Atmospheres and the Intentionality of Moods” in the prestigious European Journal of Philosophy by KOIAS member Takuya Niikawa, co-authored with Pablo Fernandez Velasco.

Published by Wiley, the European Journal of Philosophy is a highly regarded international journal that brings together work from both analytic and continental philosophical traditions. The article develops a new account of the intentionality of moods, arguing that moods are not directed simply at “everything” or at “nothing,” but rather at atmospheres.

This publication is the second major article on atmospheres by the two authors, following their 2025 article “What are atmospheres?” in *The Philosophical Quarterly*. Together, the two works make an important contribution to the analytic philosophical study of atmospheres, linking questions in philosophy of mind, phenomenology, metaphysics, and affective experience.
